



## **2016 Census Update: Age and Sex & Type of Dwelling**

Distribution by sex in Burlington is split 48%/52% between male and female, with an average of 2.5 people per household (unchanged from 2011 and lowest within Halton Region which has a 2.8 average), and a population density per square km of 987.3 - up from 946.8 in 2011.

Burlington has historically had the highest average age within Halton Region, and this increasing trend continues with an average age of 42.3 (median ages were 41.8 in 2011 and 40.3 in 2006) compared to the Regions 39.4 average. Between 2011 to 2016, Burlington experienced a decline in the 15 to 49 age group and increase in the 50+ age group. As a percentage of the total population, the 50+ age groups are the only ones to have consistently increased population shares. The 0-14 age group represents 16.7% of Burlington's total population, ages 15-64 represent 64%, and lastly those 65+ represents 19.3% which is higher than the regional, provincial and national ratios of 14.9%, 16.7% and 16.9%.

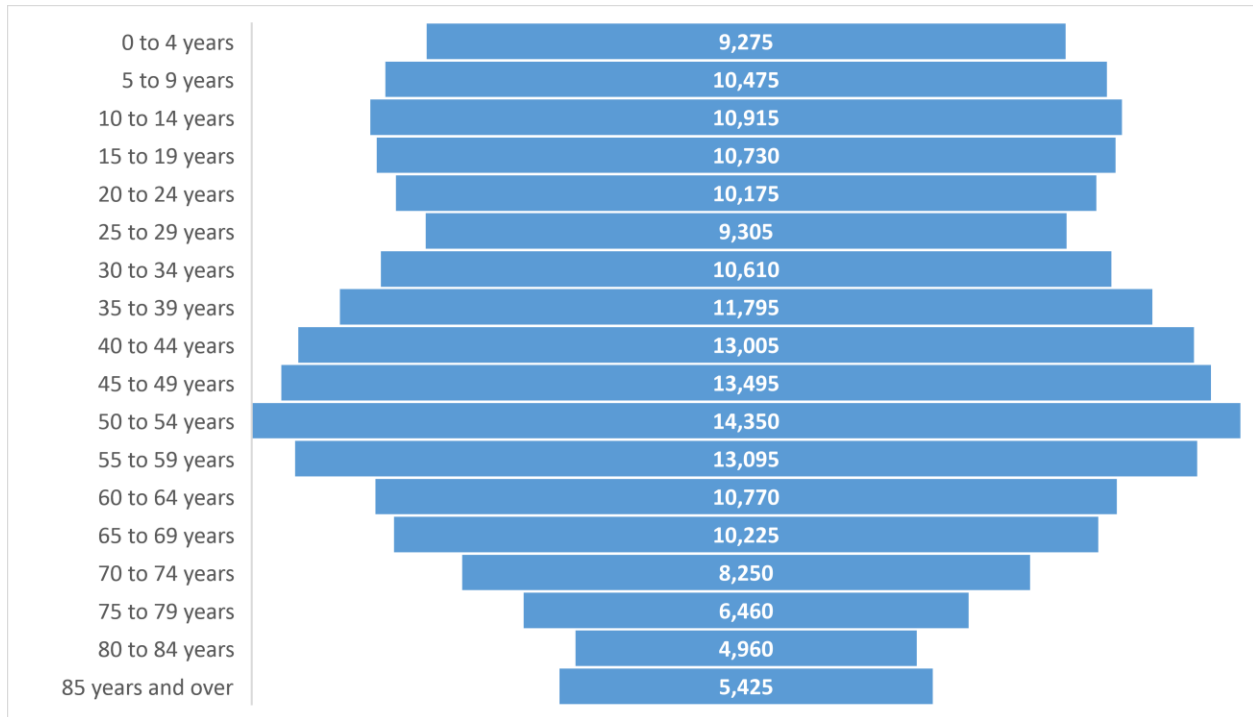
Apartments are the fastest growing private dwelling type in Burlington between 2011 to 2016, specifically in buildings with 5 storeys or more which added 970 occupancies, an increase of 9.2% from 2011. Those with fewer than 5 storeys increased at a rate of 9% with 470 more occupancies, followed by row and single-detached houses (3.1% and 1.9% respectively)<sup>1</sup>. The largest share of residents are living in some form of house, with recent trends indicating residential occupancy is shifting towards rental/condo units.

This 2016 Census release indicates an aging population and shift towards smaller residential units in Burlington.

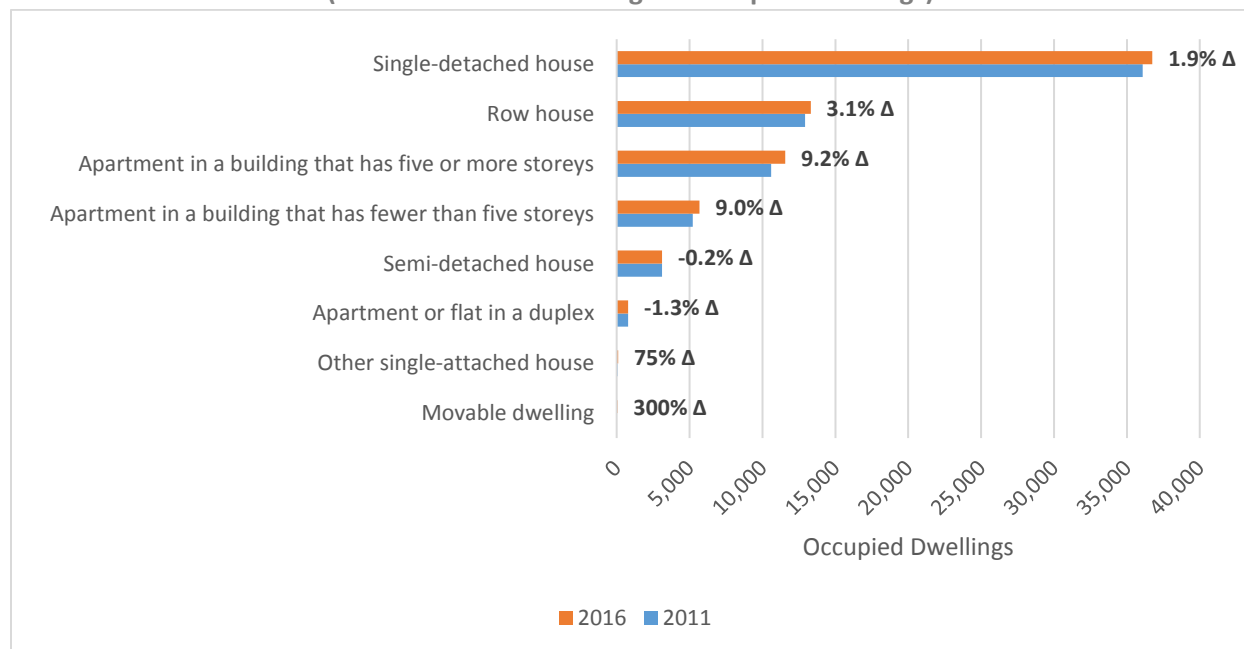
## Age Distribution in Burlington – 2016
